During the first 60 days, they discovered operational requirements for land, commodities, and other logistics was critical to setting the environment in support of the eventual deployment of over 3,000 US personnel. This required the coordinated support of the local business community. USARAF facilitated filling their requirements by partnering with businesses in Liberia.

	Operational Energy is a significant constraint with our Partner Nation militaries in the USAFRICOM AOR and seriously degrades their capacity to effectively execute critical mission sets, resulting in a security concern.
1345 – 1430	The intent of this discussion is to explore opportunities to introduce an operational energy component into our engagement activities with Partner Nations in the execution of the Theater Security Cooperation (TSC) strategy.
	This event provides an opportunity for us to share knowledge and exchange best practices promoting cooperation and collaboration for the common purpose of addressing infrastructure, environment, and energy requirements associated with military installations and military missions in Africa. The goals of an Operational Energy Program are to: Ensure energy is not an operational constraint; Improve energy efficiency at military installations; Reduce energy costs to militaries; Enhancing operational readiness; and Aiding in advancing military capabilities.

0815 – 0945	USAFRICOM's Women, Peace, and Security (WPS) initiative is focused on three primary lines of effort which are peace keeping operations, gender mainstreaming, and staff education/awareness. Rather than emphasize stand-alone events that simply "check the box", the command integrates WPS concepts into existing operations, exercises, plans, and engagements. Examples of concepts include scenarios to counter Conflict-Related Sexual Violence for use in training/exercises, gender mainstreaming seminars in Africa focusing on best practices/lessons learned, and WPS education activities for USAFRICOM staff/leadership.

	African Medical Security Facilitated by: Lt. Col. J. Michael Cline, AFAFRICA Chief of Global Health Engagement
1000 – 1045	Headquarters U.S. Air Forces Europe-Africa will facilitate a discussion on the following African medical infrastructure topics: Partnerships that promote African role 2 level medical security, infrastructure, and medical care; Partnerships to increase and sustain African Medical Evacuation (MEDEVAC) capabilities by air and ground (to include alternate runways); Ensuring safe blood, oxygen concentrators, and Telemedicine capabilities for remote locations; and the requirements to sustain rural role 2 like facilities to support disaster response and medical security.
	Combating Food Insecurity Facilitated by: Dr. Rockfeler P. Herisse, Ph.D., USAID/Guinea-Sierra Leone
1045 – 1130	A three-pronged strategy is applied by the USG to combat food insecurity. USAID address acute food insecurity throughout Africa by aligning the resources of the USG to complement the commitment expressed by Host Nations and leveraging the private sector. The partnership approach is carried out via the 24-agency Feed the Future initiative lead by USAID for agricultural development while applying lessons from the Green Revolution with particular attention to nutrition. The USAID Office for Disaster Assistance and the Food for Peace Program address food insecurity needs in emergency situations like countries affected by natural (i.e. drought, famine, etc.) or other disasters (i.e. Ebola Virus Disease epidemic) through a combination of cash, vouchers, and in-kind food assistance, as appropriate and feasible. Lastly, the USG partners with the World Food Program and other local institutions to provide food aid to vulnerable populations in schools, camps, and shelters to offset major crises linked to availability of food.
